Reading

We began our term with a whole class study of Scots poems. We looked at some Scots vocabulary and practised reading with good expression.

How you can help at home

Numeracy and Maths

Numeracy

In numeracy, we will look at **multiplication**. We will look at how times tables are built up and use concrete materials to display equal groups and write sentences about them. We will learn that multiplication is commutative (2 x 5 is the same as 5 x 2).

Maths

In maths we will be learning more about money. We will revise the names of coins and notes and learn how to work out amounts to pay for goods.

Interdisciplinary Learning

During our 'Heart of Scotland' topic we focussed on the Scottish Borders. We have learned about different towns in the Scottish Borders and how the landscape changes from West to East.



Through our next topic, '**Community Heroes**', we will find out about local organisations and how they provide for the needs of the community.

We will be able to identify jobs that are needed to run a business and will understand how each job contributes to its success.
