<u>Reading</u>

We'll continue reading for enjoyment this term, with two novels to challenge and engage us. Some children will be reading Scarlet Ibis, and some The Wreck of the Zanzibar. We have the opportunity to read everyday, both in reading lessons, and also in a quiet reading time. The children have a book of their own to read at this time. We have a well-stocked classroom library, with factual books and stories, but sometimes children bring in a book from home to read too, and that's great! We borrow our factual books from the school library, and these will be books about countries across the world.





From Brazil to Bosnia Herzegovina, why do people live where they do? We'll be finding out what makes different parts of the world good to live in, and the challenges.

It feels like we're all Daisy and Dandy settled in to P6/7, we had a busy first term, getting to know each other and I have found out where everybody is in their learning journey.

Themed Learning

Our main theme this term is Human Impact. We'll be thinking about global settlement patterns, and why people live where they do in the world. We might consider geographical features, climate and land use.

Mathematics

In maths we have considered and learnt different ways to carry out addition problems both in our head, and on paper. The children were encouraged to think about which way is best for them, is it quick, easy and most important accurate? We'll continue learning about calculations in this way, working with multiplication.

We'll also continue to debate the use of showing our working, sometimes a task just needs an answer, but often I encourage showing working. This shows me that pupils are making sense of numbers, and it's a good habit for High School and examinations. You can get extra points for showing your working!

We'll also be looking at time, and these units of work are linked to the world around us. A question for discussion might be:

What time do you need to be away from Edenside to get to the Abbey Row Centre for 4pm? And is there time to stop at Greggs on the way?!

<u>Health and Well-being</u>

We continue on our whole school journey in Health and Well being, and the main theme across the school is **Healthy**. We'll be talking about our diet, exercise and the challenges we face as we grow up. Mrs Rhodes will also work on looking after our bodies and keeping healthy in PE.

The next Building Resilience unit across the school is called "Talk it Over". In this unit the children will learn that feeling worried is normal, and everyone gets worried at times. We'll be talking about how important it is to get help if the worries don't go away.

Can you think of a time where you shared a worry, was it "a problem shared is a problem halved"?
