<u>Literacy</u> Reading

Following initial assessments and the whole class modelling block, the children will begin reading their first group novels this term. They will continue to be encouraged to work with increasing independence as they use our reading strategies to explore one of the following texts:







Please support your child to complete their set reading at home and also encourage your child to read regularly for enjoyment—books, leaflets, magazines, comics, recipes—we believe that a little reading everyday is one of the best things you can do to improve learning across the curriculum.

Writing, Spelling and Grammar

This term we will explore the features of Persuasive Writing. The children might have some requests for you—will you be ready for their arguments? We will also be creating Explanation texts linked to our learning theme on 'Human Impact and Global Settlement Patterns.' In both genres, we will continue to develop increasingly more complex vocabulary, looking at 'openers' and 'connectives' in particular. The children will also be encouraged and supported to apply their learning in spelling lessons to all written work across the curriculum and to edit and self correct any mistakes.

The Term Ahead

October-December 2019

Health and Wellbeing

We continue on our whole school journey in Health and Well being, and the main theme across the school is **Healthy**. We'll be talking about our diet, exercise and the challenges we face as we grow up into our own, independent people. Mrs Rhodes will also work on looking after our bodies and keeping healthy in PE.

We're continuing to use the Building Resilience resource across the school, and our next unit is called "Talk it Over". In this unit the children will learn that feeling worried is normal, and everyone gets worried at times. We'll be talking about how important it is to get help if the worries don't go away. Can you think of a time where you shared a worry—was it 'a problem shared is a problem halved'?

Numeracy - Addition, Subtraction, Multiplication and Division

We will begin this term by continuing to apply both mental strategies and the standard written methods to addition and subtraction problems. The children will be encouraged to think about which way is best for them, is it quick, easy and most important—accurate? We will then revise multiplication facts of known tables, focussing on accuracy and speed of recall. We will further develop mental and written strategies for multiplication and division and use these to solve a range of multi-step problems. Multiplication facts are crucial to work on multiplication and division. Please ask your child about online websites and games which we use in school and recommend to practise times tables.

Maths—Measurement and Money
We will explore methods to calculate the
perimeter and area of a shapes, which will
conclude our measurement unit.
We will then use our knowledge of the four
operations to help us to solve calculations
involving money. This will also allow us to revisit
Place Value, as we explore and work with
decimals.

Number Talks and Problem Solving
Planned 'Number Talks' and Problem Solving
tasks will continue to be a regular part of our
week. These activities encourage learners to
think about the concepts, going beyond the
recall of knowledge and encouraging them to
explain their thinking.

Prodigy is an engaging game based maths platform that has been introduced to P6 and P7 which encourages self-paced practice in and out of school. It includes over 1400 skills that adapt as the pupils play. You can also set up a parent account in order to monitor and support your child's learning.

At the moment the children are practising a wide range of skills but as we move through the term, activities and games will link to our focus areas in numeracy and maths.
