With some help from a sibling or adult, can you learn the days of the week in French? You can use the worksheet attached to help you.</p>	<p>Why not develop your fine motor skills by creating an Eiffel Tower using Lego or any other building blocks you may have at home?</p>	<p>You could make your own book of pictures. Describe your pictures to an adult or sibling and ask them to write down what you say. Keep the book as a memory or to give to a family member as a present.</p>	<p>Use the alphabet dot-to-dot attached to make a picture of a snail!</p> 
<p>How old are you? Can you say this in French? 2 – deux 3- trois 4 – quatre 5 – cinq</p>	<p>Ask an adult or sibling to help you make some crepes. How much flour will you need? How many eggs? https://www.delish.com/uk/cookie/recipes/a29620492/easy-basic-crepe-recipe/</p>	<p>Have a listen/watch some French number songs on Youtube. Can you recognise any of the numbers?</p>	<p>Why don't you create a French flag? Which colours will you need to use? How many colours do you need? What shape is it?</p>	<p>If you are out for a walk, can you look out for numbers on buses, house doors, car number plates?</p>
<p>Why not try making 'Le Choco Fondant' (chocolate brownies) from Max's French Cookbook. https://www.easy-french-food.com/easy-brownie-recipe.html</p>	<p>You could use straws to cut and stick on paper to create your very own Eiffel Tower!</p> 	<p>Here is a lovely dance video of a little girl in France. Get your dancing shoes on and dance along with her! https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=y8p0BxMykqg</p>	<p>Take a trip to Paris and take part in some Yoga! https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=r_JI45fSbXM</p>	<p>Ask an adult or sibling to help you set up a 'Tour de France' in the garden or outside. Make a short route to bike around. You could make this more challenging by following a number track!</p>
<p>'Magic Milk Experiment'. You will need full fat milk, food colouring, fairy liquid, cotton buds and a dish with a flat bottom. What happens to the milk when you add the ingredients? What happens when you put the cotton bud in?</p>	<p>You could help make baguettes for lunch. A baguette is a French loaf. What fillings are you going to use? Enjoy!</p>	<p>Does anyone in your house have a world map? If not have a look online and try and find France. How far away is it from us? Is it bigger than Scotland?</p> 	<p>Make a musical instrument using recycled bottles. Add rice or pasta to the bottles. You could even decorate these. Play 'Frere Jaque' and use your instrument to play along to the beat.</p>	<p>Why not pretend you are going on holiday? Pack a small bag, dress up and enjoy the outdoors on a sunny day. Why not pretend you are going to Paris?</p>
