# Letter Writing

Imagine that you are the lion. Write a letter home to your family and tell them about your adventure. Can you also tell them how you felt on the trip—what made you nervous, excited, happy, proud, sad?

#### Visualiser

First draw a picture of the lion from the story in the middle of your page. Next using arrows coming from the lion, surround the lion with facts you have learned about him from the story. What describing words would you use to describe his personality? Record your answers around your lion.

# Multiplication Catch

Choose which times table you are going to practise. Now throw a ball (or cuddly toy) in the air, when you catch it you say the next number in the sequence (3, 6, 9, 12, 15, ...) How far can you continue? Can you do better next time?

You can vary the exercise by throwing the ball via a wall, or under your leg. Or you could ask someone to join in and throw it back and forth - each person saying the next number in the sequence.

# Snakes & Ladders

Design your own snake and ladders game. Each box should hold an addition or subtraction sum. Try to think back to the types of sums we learned in class for example:

- -2 digit add 1 digit (45+5)
- -2 digit add a tens number (34+40)
- -2 digit add a 2 digit (23+16)

Play the game with a brother/sister/parent/carer. If you don't have a dice you can use a stack of cards with the numbers 1-6, mix them well. Remember you don't always have to solve the sum in your head. Use a scrap piece of paper and a pencil to help you.

# **Matching Times**

Cut up pieces of paper until they are post-it note sized (or use post-it notes if you have them).

Write a time and then draw what that time would look like on an analogue clock.

On separate pieces of paper write the same time but draw what it would look like on a *digital* clock.

Mix up the paper and play a matching game.

You could turn the paper over and play a game of pairs with someone else.

# Time Challenge

Write down 5 things you do at home (e.g. have breakfast, go for a shower, have a walk...).

Time how long it takes you to do these things and put them in order from shortest to longest.

# <u>Cereal box challenge - balance and agility</u>

A game to play on your own or with the family.

Start with an empty cereal box placed on the floor.

The aim is to pick the box up with your teeth without touching the floor with your hands or your knees and get back up to a standing position. Everyone involved in the game has a go and if you touch the floor you are out (you might decide to can have 2/3 goes). When everyone has had a go, rip a short section off the top of the box all the way around to make it shorter - approx. 2 cm. Then start round two. The game ends when there is only one person left or you just have the bottom of the box left.

#### Fitness stations

Why not create your own fitness stations? Mark out 3 areas so that at each area you do a different exercise for 1 minute.

For example at station 1 you could run on the spot. Station 2 you could do squats. Station 3 you could do star jumps. Get an adult to help time the minute.

Saute à la corde	Skip	You can do this using a skipping rope or just skipping!

Compte des arbres	Count trees	Count the trees you see on a walk, in your garden or around your house!
Compte des oiseaux	Count birds	Pick a location and watch for a set time, how many birds can you see?
Rebondi une balle	Bounce a ball	Bounce a ball as many times as you can. Count in French as you're doing it and note your highest score!
Fais la planche	Do a plank	Hold it for as long as you can and count in Frenchi
Joue à la marelle	Play hopscotch	Make a hopscotch grid outside and say the numbers in French as you play!
Fals des "keeple upples"	Do some keeple upplest	Do as many as you can and count them up in French as you gol
Fais des saute d'étailes	Do some star jumps	Do as many as you can and count them in French as you gol
Pose comme un arbre	Do a yoga tree pose	Hold it for as long as you can and count in Frenchi
Danse le floss	Dance the floss	Do as many flosses as you can and count them in French. Switch to other dances if you know them!
Compte les insectes	Count insects	Do a minibeast count. In an area outside, see how many insects you can find and note your numbers in French.
