<p><b>Look On the Bright Side</b></p> <p>Skipper says: The way we think can affect the way we feel. Sometimes when things are tough or when we are unsure, we might think certain thoughts like "I'm rubbish at basketball. I bet I don't even catch the ball". This can then affect the way we feel. Think about a time when you thought like this - how did it make you feel? If we talk nicely to ourselves, we can try and change those feelings.
