Scavenger Hunt

Here are some ideas for Scavenger Hunts you can go on as part of your daily exercise:

Tiny treasure hunt:

Hunt for really small things you can fit into a matchbox. Collect little leaves, blades of grass, small snail shells, tiny twigs, feathers and pebbles. Turn it into a competition with your family - who can fit the most items inside their box?

Texture Scavenger Hunt:

A scavenger hunt doesn't have to be sight-based. Have a go at exploring with your other senses, such as touch. Can you find...

- smooth stones
- furry catkins
- rough bark
- a tickly feather
- spongy moss

Colour/Letter Scavenger Hunt:

Pick a colour and see how many different natural items you can spot that are the same colour. Choose a letter of the alphabet and hunt for objects starting with that letter.

Winter Scavenger Hunt:

Trees may be bare and animals tucked up in hibernation, but there's still plenty to spot on a trip to the woods in winter.

- glossy evergreen leaves
- a lacy leaf skeleton
- bumpy bark
- fallen tree cones
- a y-shaped stick
- animal tracks on the ground

Make a deciduous tree picture.

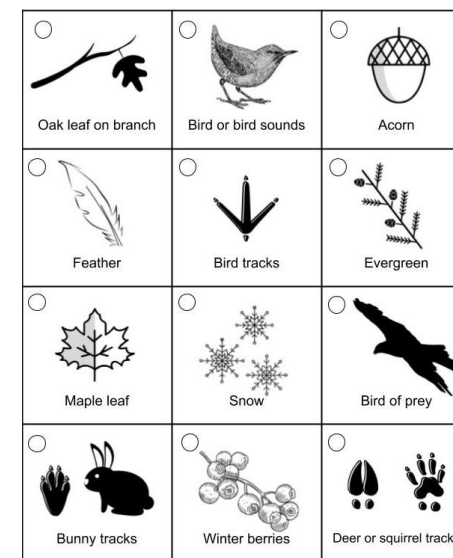
