Literacy

Reading: We begin by immersing ourselves in the world of Victorian London through viewing and applying the 6 reading strategies to the 1984 film of Oliver Twist by Charles Dickens. Our engagement with this 'text' will revolve around class discussion. This will be supported by lots non-fiction reading. This is extended by our modelling block novel 'The Eleventh Orphan' by Joan Lingard and deepened by various non-fiction texts. Writing

This term we'll develop our handwriting with sessions delivered by Miss Davidson. Writing skills development will see us revisit the basic component parts of a sentence then develop that to focus on well structured paragraphs.

Spelling and Grammar

In spelling we are continuing with our High Frequency Words, phonics and vocabulary building skills this term and building our confidence using our spelling strategies. In grammar this term we are working through various types of vocabulary, openers, connectives and punctuation (VCOP). This will see us learn about clauses and phrases.

Curriculum Overview

August - October 2022

Topic

The Victorians.

We'll relish revelations about the Victorian era, building an understanding of the age through non-fiction and fiction reading, film, websites, art, music, discussion, presentations and drama. We'll share our learning with others too.

MAD- Music/Art/Drama. P7W will start off the year with music exploring different musical cultures, making music with the voice, instruments and technology. Additionally we'll get to know and use musical terminology.

Numeracy & Maths

Numeracy

This term we are looking at revisiting place value, engaging with varied strategies for addition and subtraction. Using standard algorithms for addition and subtraction. Problem solving with addition and subtraction- including with decimals and fractions.

Maths

We will investigate 'time' in analogue, digital, world zones and historical time (BCE, CE). We will look at how some prominent Victorians used maths and the impact maths has on the world around us.

Swimming- There are 10 sessions of swimming on Monday afternoon- the last is Monday 7^{th} November.

Mr Sutton will be engaging the pupils in team games and hockey throughout this term. PE days are Tuesday and Thursday- on Thursday pupils can come in wearing their PE kit.

The core focus in class this term involves building resilience which means investigating the importance and benefits of 'taking a moment': knowing when and how to do that.

- The Gardens of Getting Unstuck
- The Kingdom of Contribution

We will be looking more in depth at each of the Kingdoms and how they can benefit and support us throughout our learning. Showbie will be used to set personal goals and track our progress toward them.
