Literacy

In reading we will be learning to:

- Recognise an increasing number of common words.
- Use our knowledge of phonics to sound out unfamiliar words
- Identify what has happened in the story.
- Read with increasing fluency.
- Show understanding by completing a follow up task.

In writing we will be learning to:

- Consistently use capital letters, finger spaces and full stops in our sentences
- Use question marks and exclamation marks.
- Use conjunctions and openers to make our sentences more interesting.
- Form all letters correctly.
- Develop our fine motor skills which will help us write neatly.
- Use a word bank to spell key vocabulary in our writing.
- Read over our writing to check that it makes sense.
- Create descriptive and narrative pieces of writing using adjectives.

In listening and talking we will be learning to:

- Be a respectful listener by looking at the person who is talking.
- Ask open questions to find out more information.
- Take part in group and class discussions.
- Share ideas when appropriate.
- Perform a Scots poem using expression and pace.

Important Information

Please support your child to be ready for school by:

Numeracy and Maths

Multiplication

We will be learning to:

- Count forwards and backwards in steps of 2, 5 and 10.
- Use strategies such as repeated addition or arrays to solve multiplication problems.
- Use the correct vocabulary when multiplying.

Division

We will be learning to:

- Group and share equally using practical materials. (P2)
- Divide whole numbers by 10 (P3).
- Recognise the relationship between multiplication and division.
- Use different strategies to divide.
- Use the correct vocabulary when dividing.

Time

We will be learning to:

- Tell the time for o'clock, half past (quarter past and quarter to for some).
- Identify AM and PM.
- Know the number of days in a week, months in a year and minutes in an hour.
- Sequence the months of the year and match these to the seasons.
- Write the date.

Health and Wellbeing:

PE – In PE we will be learning fundamental movement skills through different 'adventures' and fitness.

My body- We will be learning about our bodies, including the PANTS rule and the correct terminology for male and female body parts.

Zones of Regulation – We will continue to explore our emotions and the emotions of others using the zones of regulation. For more information, please see our last curriculum overview.

IDL:

Scottish Food and Scottish Castles

- We will begin our Scotland focus by looking at different food produced in Scotland and why different types of agriculture are important. We will learn about and try different Scottish foods.
- We will learn about castles in the local area and why the features are important. We will then learn about what life was like in a castle by acting out different roles.
