<u>Literacy</u>

Reading

We will read non-fiction, fiction and poetry together as modelled and group texts, developing and extending our core comprehension strategies. In Primary 5 these are Prior Knowledge, Metalinguistics, Visualisation, Summarising, Inference and Main Ideas.

<u>Writing</u>

We will develop our descriptive, expository, and persuasive writing by using:

- adjectives and adverbs
- the past, present and future verb tenses
- commas to structure lists and to add additional detail within a sentence.
- sentence openers relating to time and position.
- a wider range of conjunctions to extend our sentences. Some of us will also use conjunctions as sentence openers.

<u>Oracy</u>

Oracy is the ability to express ourselves fluently and grammatically in speech.

Primary 5 will be focusing on reciting poems, with particular emphasis on speaking clearly, pronouncing words using a Scottish accent, pace, gesture, facial expressions, and intonation.



We will also be leading the Easter/Spring assembly where again the focus will be on presenting to others.



P5 Curriculum Overview

<u>January – March</u>

STEM -Food and Textile Technologies

This term, making links with our topics:

- we will develop our food preparation and cooking skills.
- we will explore and use various textiles finding out about their properties and uses.

TOPICS



In January we will

- study some 'Scottish Myths and Legends'. We will develop our storytelling and iPad skills, showcasing what we have learned through a range of drama, written and art activities.
- study some poems developing our understanding of imagery, literacy features and Scots vocabulary.

Invaders and Settlers -Romans at Trimontium



Through February and March, we will

- immerse ourselves in Roman Culture including Homes, Food, Arts and Entertainment. We will learn about this in the context of the Roman Camp at Trimontium.
- work with the Trimontium Museum staff and hope to visit the museum in March.

Numeracy & Maths

Numeracy

In numeracy we will be developing our number processes by

- making links between addition and subtraction.
- using empty number lines and written methods to calculate answers to addition and subtraction sums.
- learning about fractions, decimals, and percentages.
- learning about multiples, factors, and primes.
- calculating answers to multiplication and division sums by counting in multiples, grouping, sharing, drawing arrays and written methods.

<u>Maths</u>

We will be consolidating:

• telling the time using analogue and digital clocks, calculating time durations, and using timetables.

We will be learning to

- calculate with money including electronic transactions.
- identify and calculate using the Roman number system.

<u>Learning Heroes</u>

- We will 'meet' and use our learning heroes, 'The DIY Doctor' and 'Mistake Magician'.
- We will continue to develop our resilience, motivation, and engagement, helping us to learn from our mistakes and to improve our skills.
- We will continue to encourage and motivate each other to achieve our goals.

Health and Wellbeing

<u>My Body</u>

In Primary 5 we will be learning about 'Substance Use', reviewing our knowledge of substances and how to make the right choices. We will be focussing on Tobacco, Drugs, Alcohol and Solvents.



Zones of Regulation

We will continue to develop our knowledge and understanding of the 'Zones of Regulation' to help us to regulate our emotions.



<u>P.E.</u>

In P.E. we will be working on different types of fitness and methods of training. We will be learning to play Handball and will be developing our Handball skills.
