Literacy

In reading we will be learning to:

- Use our knowledge of phonics to sound out and blend unfamiliar words.
- Read with increasing fluency.
- Select a text for enjoyment and choice and explain our preferences for author or illustrations.
- Reads aloud a familiar piece of text adding expression.
- Show understanding of a text by completing a follow up task.
- Identify key vocabulary in the text such as nouns, verbs, adjectives and adverbs.
- Use the cover, title, illustrations, characters, author, and blurb to help develop an understanding of a text.

In spelling we will be learning to:

- Use the correct vocabulary associated with our sounds e.g. phonemes, graphemes, digraphs and trigraphs.
- Use strategies to sound out and blend words.
- Use the correct written formation of our sounds.
- Use our understanding of new sounds to write words.

In writing we will be learning to:

- Use capital letters and full stops when writing sentences.
- Use knowledge of phonics and spelling strategies when spelling unfamiliar words.
- Self-assess our writing against the success criteria.
- Use a wider range of descriptive language techniques.
- Use varying sentence openers.
- Create narrative stories using a story rollercoaster to plan a plot.

Numeracy

Subtraction

We will be learning to:

- Subtract a two 2-digit number from a 2-digit number.
- Develop our knowledge of subtraction strategies.
- Demonstrate understanding of related fact for addition and subtraction within 100.
- Subtract a single digit from a 3-digit number and 2-digit number from a 3-digit number.

Multiplication

We will be learning to:

- Develop fluency with counting in groups of 2s,5s, 10s, 3s and 4s, making links to the relevant times tables.
- Developing an understanding of multiplication as repeated addition.
- Solve a range of multiplication calculations
- Multiply single and 2-digit numbers by 10 and 100.

Maths

Measurement

We will be learning to:

- Estimate and measure length, height, mass and capacity to the nearest standard unit.
- Use the most appropriate instrument to help us measure and read their scales accurately.

Grid References

We will be learning to:

- Identify where and when grid references are used.
- Describe, plot and use accurate two figure grid references, demonstrating knowledge of the horizontal and vertical location.

Mathematics – its impact on the World past, present and future

We will be learning to:

- Investigate and share understanding of the importance of numbers in learning, life and work.
- Investigate and share understanding of a variety of number systems used throughout history.

We will be using the LEANS programme to help us understand neurodiversity and how everyone is unique.

We will be learning to:


- Compare aspects of peoples daily lives in the past with our own.
