

Literacy

In reading we will be learning to:

- Use our knowledge of phonics to sound out and blend unfamiliar words.
- Read with increasing fluency.
- Select a text for enjoyment and choice and explain our preferences for author or illustrations.
- Increase our awareness of the importance of punctuation in text including direct speech, bold letters and capitalisation.
- Use strategies to clarify the meaning of words in a text.
- Identify the purpose of a text.

In spelling we will be learning to:

- Use the correct vocabulary associated with our sounds e.g. phonemes, graphemes, digraphs and trigraphs.
- Use strategies to sound out and blend words.
- Use the correct written formation of our sounds.
- Use our understanding of new sounds to write words.

In writing we will be learning to:

- Use a wider range of punctuation when writing sentences.
- Use knowledge of phonics and spelling strategies when spelling unfamiliar words.
- Self and peer-assess our writing against the success criteria.
- Use time related fronted adverbials in our sentences.
- Understand and use contractions correctly in our writing.
- Understand prefixes and suffixes.
- Use features of expository writing to create our own pieces of writing, such as instructions and reports.

Numeracy

Division

We will be learning to:

- Solve a one-step division problem using concrete materials.
- Share items into smaller equal groups.
- Determine the number of equal groups
- Link knowledge of multiplication facts to division.
- Divide a multiple of 10 by 10.
- Divide a multiple of 100 by 10 and 100.

Maths

Patterns and Relationships

We will be learning to:

- recognise and describe number patterns using understanding of counting in 1s, 10s, 2s, 5s, 100s.
- count forwards and backwards in 2s, 5s, 10's and 100s within 100/1000.

Shape

- Name and identify a range of 2D and 3D shapes.
- Identify 3D shapes from 2D drawings.
- Identify vertical, horizontal and diagonal lines.

Money

- Identify, name and order coins and notes.
- Explore different ways to make the same total.
- Add the cost of 2/3 items.
- Begin to calculate change.

Fractions

- Explain the role of the numerator and denominator.
- Split shapes to demonstrate various fractions.
- Compare the size of fractions.
- Use concrete materials/knowledge of division to find fractions of amounts.

IDL

This term our focus for IDL is Scotland and its traditions, followed by Space. We will be learning to:

- Explore our local environment and landscapes, describing how the land has been used.
- Explore a variety of foods produced in Scotland and discuss the importance of agriculture in the production of food.



In our Space topic we will be learning to:
