Phonics

We will be learning to:

- Use strategies to sound out and blend words.
- Use the correct written formation of our sounds.
- Use our understanding of new sounds to read and write words.

Reading

We will be learning to:

- Blend sounds together to read words with increasing fluency.
- Be able to identify who is in the story, what they are doing and where they are doing it.
- *Please use your child's Oxford Owl account to access reading homework.*

Writing

We will be learning to:

- Consistently use capital letters, finger spaces and full stops in our sentences.
- Form all letters correctly.
- Develop our fine motor skills which will help us write neatly.
- Read over our writing to check that it makes sense.
- Write a recount about an experience we have had.

Listening and Talking

We will be learning to:

- Be a respectful listener by looking at the person who is talking.
- Ask open questions to find out more information.
- Take part in group and class discussions.
- Share ideas when appropriate.
- Find and discuss interesting vocabulary.

Growing

With our local area in mind, we will consider how the land around us is used. We will learn what plants need to grow and have lots of hands on experience with planting and growing. We will visit Kelso Community Garden and the Hirsell in Coldstream.

Numeracy and Maths

Patterns and Relationships

We will be learning to:

- Count forwards and backwards in 2s and 10s within 0-100
- Recognise and describe a pattern
- Continue, create or draw a simple pattern using numbers, colours or shapes

Expressions & Equations

We will be learning to:

- Know that the = symbol signifies equivalence
- Compare numbers to decide which one is bigger or smaller using the greater than or less than symbol

Rounding & Estimation

We will be learning to:

- Round whole numbers to the nearest ten
- Estimate quantities within 20
- Estimate the position of any number on a number line.

Money

We will be learning to:

- Identify, name and order all coins and notes up to £10
- Explore different ways to make the same total up to 20p
- Count the total when given a set number of coins
- Add the cost of two items together
- Calculate change within 20p

Health and Wellbeing

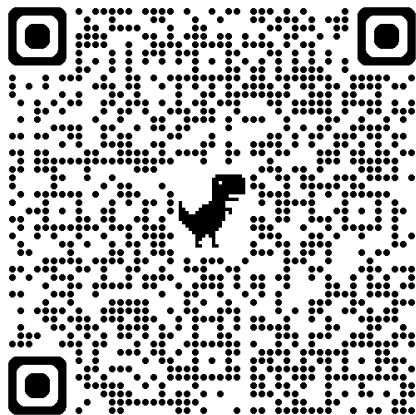

The Coin Scavenger Hunt

Ask your child to find as many coins and notes as they can around the house. Once gathered, have them name each one and line them up in a "value train" from the smallest amount (1p) to the largest (£10).
